Litter Pick - 30th March 2019 - For the last 2 years a number of leaders and young people have taken part in the annual "Great British Litter Pick". We have collected litter from the piece of wooded land between Lindley Moor Road and the M62. We will be repeating this again this year. Any help would be gratefully received. Where does your subs go.

We are often asked where your monthly subscriptions go for your child. Each year, at the end of January, we have a census of members. This data is used to calculate how much each group has to pay to the Scout Association to fund the central, regional and district running of the organisation. It roughly works out that for each young person we have to send about £40. We are fortunate at our Church that we are not charged per session, but as a thank you we donate about £1000 to the running of the Church each year. This may sound a lot, but when you realise that we have three sections running each week, that isn't a lot per session - far below the commercial rates. That doesn't leave much left to run the sections.

I hope that you agree that your subs are well worth it - less than the price of a coffee a week!

<u>Free Solo</u> - last week 6 leaders went to the Square Chapel in Halifax to watch this film. It is about Alex Honnold who free climbs (without rope etc.). It goes through his planning to climb El Capitan, a mere 3200 feet without rope. We left the cinema, exhausted and with sweaty palms - how could anyone do such a thing! If you have the chance to watch it, don't hesitate. I will plan to show the DVD to the Scouts when it is released. Anyone would be welcome.
